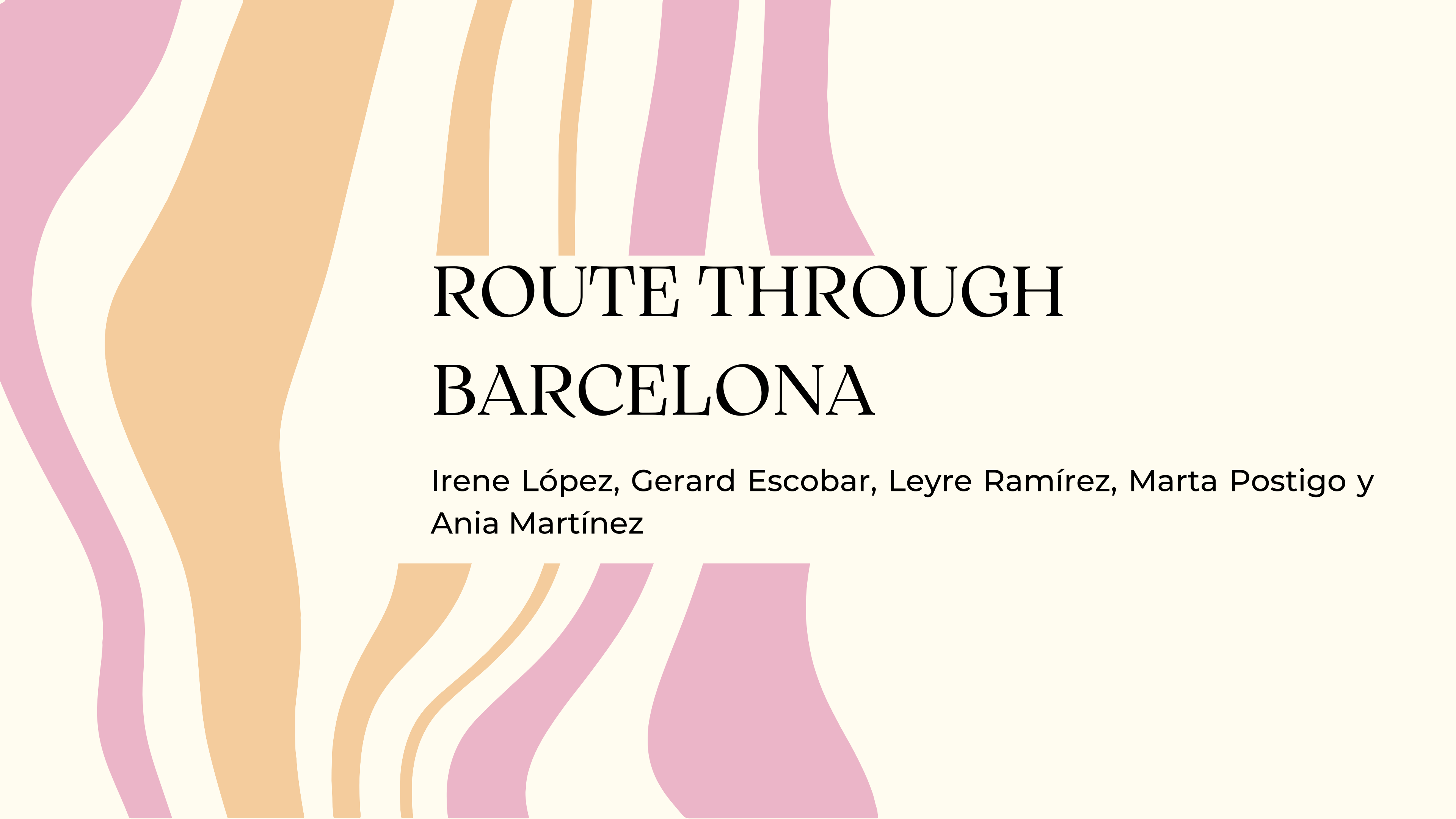

- Year in which it was founded:
Created by Joan Fontcuberta and Antoni Cumella in 2014.
- Located in isidre nonell square
- Figurative art
- Context: the origin of this photo composition is found in the tercentenary of the catalan defeat in the war of spanish succession. (September 11, 1714)
- 3 centuries
- Contains small moments of freedom



Muro del beso

La Catedral



- Construction: 1298/1420
- Creator: jaume fabre
- Style: gothic architecture
- Dedicated to Santa Eulalia: patron saint of the city, along with Santa Cruz.
- The cathedral has a Gothic cloister in which thirteen white geese live (it is said that Eulalia was thirteen when she was executed and that she herded geese on her property in Sarrià, near the city).
- The façade is from the 19th century Neo-Gothic, due to the Universal Exhibition of 1888 by Josep Oriol Mestres.

Calle / Puente del Bisbe

- It is hidden in the heart of the Gothic Quarter of Barcelona and it was built in 1928 as decoration of the streets of the city of Barcelona in the rehabilitation plan of the city for the International Exhibition of 1929 in Barcelona.
- Its architect was Joan Rubió i Bellver and the name was given to it by Bishop Manuel Irurita Almandoz who was shot in the Spanish Civil War.

- **LEGENDS:**

They say that if you walk backwards under the Bishop's Bridge while looking at the skull, that wish you ask for will be fulfilled.

Some say that it is a real skull and not a sculpture. It is also said that if someone removes the dagger, the buildings of Barcelona will collapse. Or that the souls of prisoners parade under it.



Plaça Sant Felip Neri

- The square rises above the old medieval cemetery of Montjuic del Obispo, destroyed during the Spanish Civil War.
- In the center of the square is a water fountain with an octagonal base.
- On the walls you can still see the redoubts of shrapnel from a bomb dropped during the Civil War in 1938. Caused the death of 42 children.



Baixada de Santa Eulalia

- Eulalia was locked in a barrel full of broken glass and nails that was later rolled down the slope from the beginning of the street known today as Baixada de Santa Eulàlia.
- The figure of the saint is protected by a canopy decorated with iron and mosaic ornaments and below we find an inscription that includes the verses that the poet Jacint Verdaguer

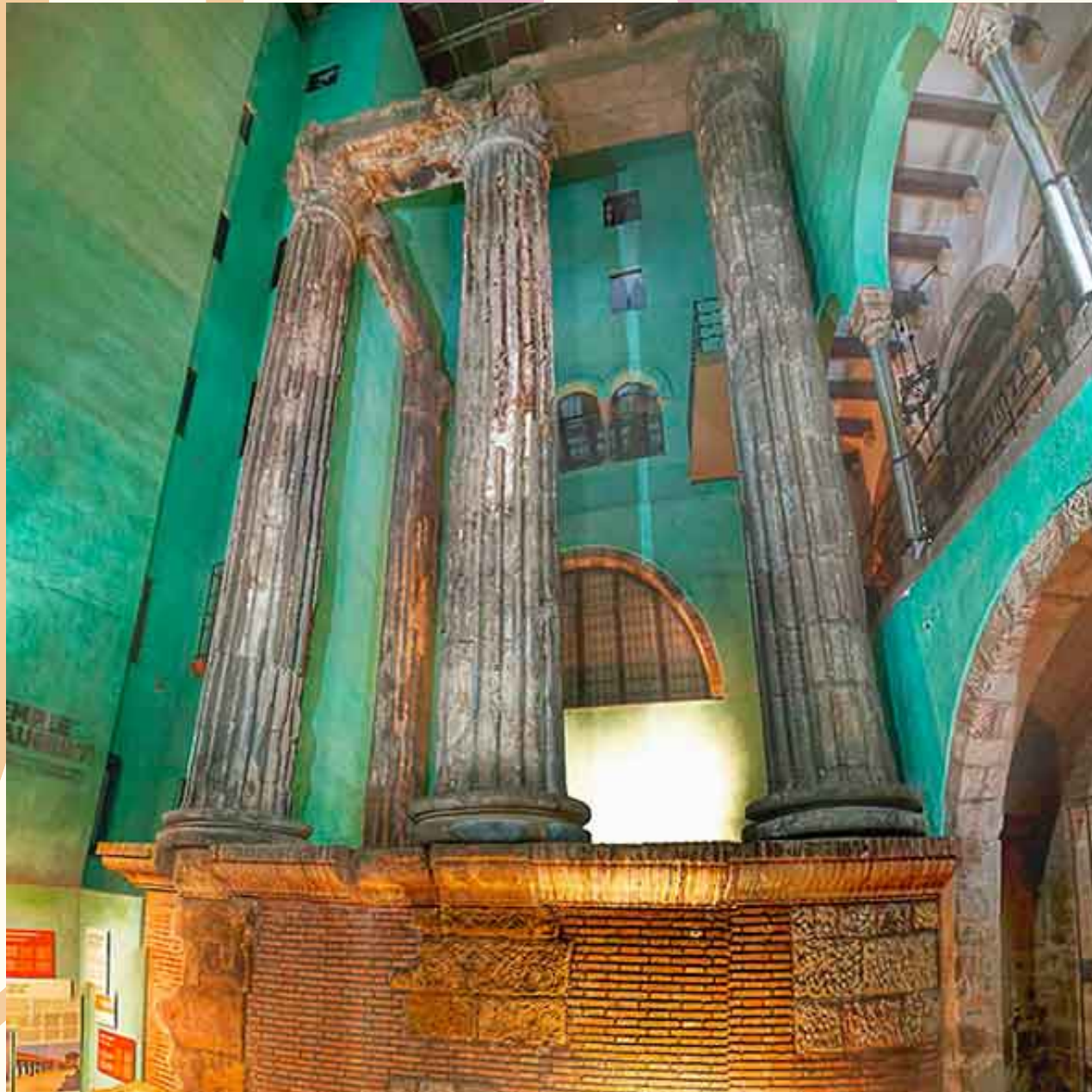


Plaza Sant Jaume



- Confronts the two political powers: generality and city council
- Roman period square
- Here was the roman forum
- Gothic and renaissance style buildings
- Neoclassical front and gothic interior
- Construction of buildings s. XV, XVI AND XVII

Templo de Augusto



- Temple dedicated to the imperial cult of Caesar Augustus, built in Barcino, later it became the city of Barcelona
- It was the central part of the Forum on top of Mount Táber, currently located in the Gothic Quarter of Barcelona.
- It collapsed over time and at the end of the 19th century four columns were found

- This name is given due to the pine tree that is found in the square itself.
- The church is in gothic/catalan style.
- Built in: 1319/1391.
- Creator: anonymous

Plaza Real

- Located in the gothic quarter and next to the boulevard.
- Urbanized in 1850
- Work of the architect: Francisco Daniel Molina
- Neoclassical style
- The square is classified as a Cultural Asset of Local Interest
- The initial destination of the land planned by the Barcelona City Council was a theater, for which a competition was called in 1841, but, finally, it was decided to project a closed square

Font de Canaletas

- The original fountain came from a tank located in the San Severo Tower of the old medieval wall, which supplied the Rambla and Raval area, dating back to the 18th century.
- It is a modest fountain in Barcelona that is one of the emblematic places where Barcelona Football Club fans celebrate their successes.
- It is located in the section of La Rambla called Rambla de Canaletas, the first going down from Plaza de Catalunya.
